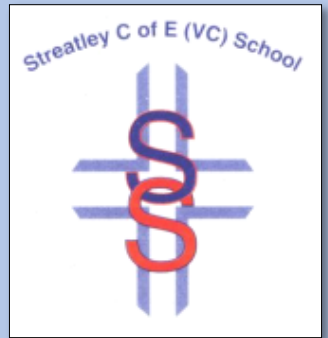

**Spelling Bee** - Coming soon to tie in with end of year expectation judgements and reports.

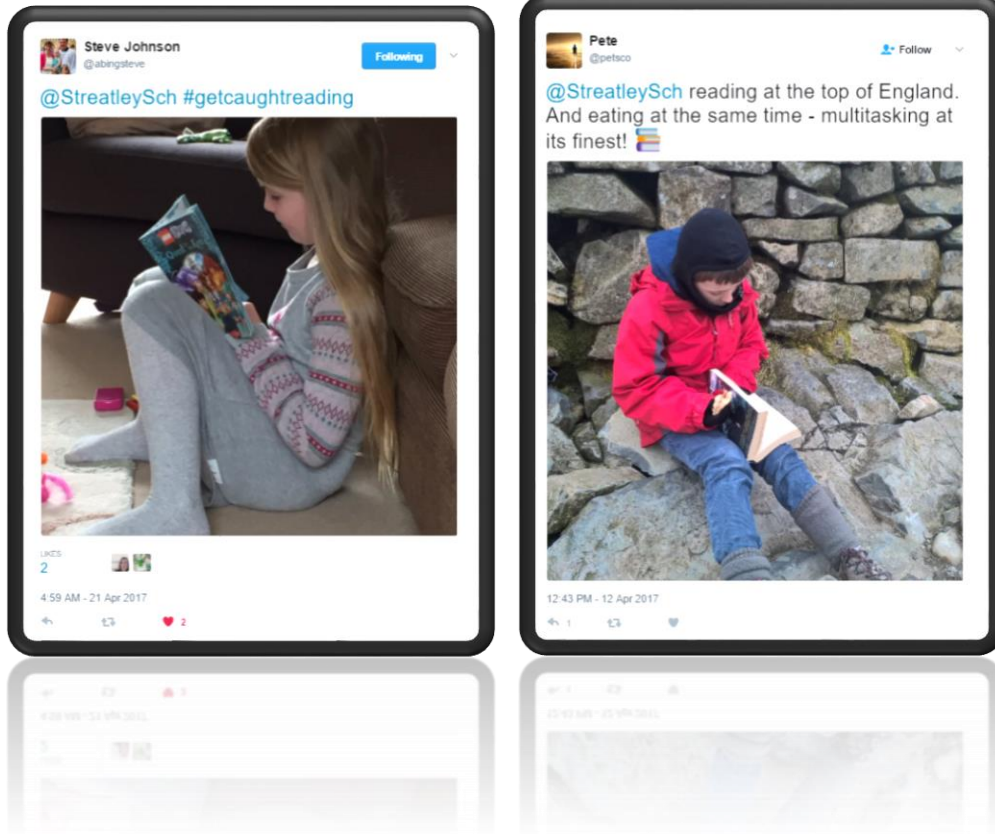


**End of year production.** Practise has begun and all children are extremely enthused as are the staff.
