The use and impact of Sports Premium at Streatley Primary School 2016/2017

Background:

For the academic year of 2016/17, the Government is continuing its support for primary school sport by providing additional funding. The funding is being jointly provided by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport, and will see money going directly to schools to be spent on improving the quality of sport and PE for all children. All state-maintained schools, academies, middle schools, special schools and pupil referral units which have primary aged pupils (as reported in the January 2016 school census) will receive the funding.

The funding is ring-fenced and therefore can **only** be spent on provision for PE and sport in schools; we will be held accountable for how the funding is used to support pupils progress and participation. Schools are required to publish on-line information about how the funding has been utilised, including details about our sporting provision alongside curriculum details. This will ensure that parents/carers and others are fully aware of the PE and sporting provision at Streatley.

Allocation:

All schools with 17 or more primary-aged pupils will receive a lump sum of £8000 plus a premium of £5 per pupil. Smaller schools will receive £500 per pupil.

For the academic year Sept 2016 – August 2017 (based on 44 primary aged pupils) we will receive an amount of £8,220.

We are developing our Sports Premium plan to raise standards and participation levels in PE throughout the school. Our rationale for the use of Sports Premium funding, which the Governors have agreed, are that it must be used so that:

- all children benefit, regardless of sporting ability, giving all children extra opportunities and experiences in a range of sporting activities;
- children are given the opportunity to compete in tournaments with other schools;
- staff have access to training opportunities and continued professional development;
- and some activities may be subsidised for PPG or special circumstances, e.g. swimming.

Sports Premium at Streatley:

At Streatley, we believe in a holistic approach to the development of sport and physical activity and have ensured the distribution of the funding compliments this. Thus far, after a comprehensive audit of our PE store, funding has been allocated to sport equipment such as: netball kit - including balls and bibs; two new cricket sets – including stumps, a variety of bat sizes and soft cricket balls; a range of cones to support teaching and tennis balls.

We have also allocated funding to enhance break and lunchtime resources such as: sponge footballs, hulahoops, spinning tops, wheelies, drop goal nets and stilts.

Finally, funding has been allocated to specialist sports teachers from active education to support PE teaching and after school clubs.

Intended Impact:

We will evaluate the impact of the Sports Premium funding as part of our normal self-evaluation and provision mapping arrangements. We will look at how well we use the Premium to improve the quality and breadth of PE and sporting provision, including increasing participation in PE and sport so that all pupils develop healthy lifestyles and reach the performance levels they are capable of.

Measuring the impact of the activities, provided with Sports Premium funding, can be achieved in many different ways: We will look at progress in PE as well as other areas of development such as independence, self-esteem, confidence and the numbers of pupils involved in sporting activities in and out of school.



Assessments are made both formally and informally using our school assessment systems as well as through feedback from staff and visitors to the school. We will also evaluate the impact of professional development opportunities in improving teaching and learning in PE. It is anticipated that at the end of the academic year we will have some hard data to show the impact of this Sports Premium funding on pupil progress and involvement in sport.
