Streatley School is justifiably proud of its reputation within the community. Within the school itself, there exists an atmosphere which encourages effort, enjoyment and a celebration of the achievements of all our pupils. The school's concern for these high standards is also reflected in the pride we take in our school uniform.

Uniform

In order to maintain a strong sense of identity and belonging within our school, we require all pupils to wear labelled school uniform which consists of:

- Navy sweatshirt and/or cardigan with school logo (available to order from [Brigade Clothing](#))
- White polo shirt tucked in
- Standard [grey school trousers](#)
- Grey skirt or [grey pinafore](#) – knee length
- Grey tights (plain) or grey or white socks
- Wind and waterproof coat with a hood
- [Wellington boots](#) –no colour specified as variety makes them easier to find.
- [Black, flat school shoes](#) - heels no higher than 4 cm **inclusive** of any platform, lace ups or with 'T' bar or strap. Good examples below. No ankle boots.
- Navy fleece with school logo – optional (available to order from [Brigade Clothing](#))

Wear trousers on the day or send in joggers so school waterproofs comfortably pull over the top

For swimming – a one-piece costume or swimming trunks (not shorts of any kind)

Hair

Hair should be neat and tidy. All hair long enough to be tied up should be so as to alleviate the problem of head lice and to save being caught in equipment. No hair products such as gel, mousse or dye are to be worn. Any hair accessories such as clips, slides or headbands should be plain blue, black, grey or white. Exceptions on the grounds of disability, race or religion or belief will be considered to ensure that judgements about hair do not discriminate against any pupil by virtue of their protected characteristics

Other items not appropriate at school

No jewellery, make up, nail varnish or temporary tattoos should be worn. Should a pupil have pierced ears, plain studs only may be worn and in order to comply with health and safety regulations, must be covered or taken out during all PE activities.

Streatley School will respect variations to our school uniform if they are directly related to established religious traditions. However, any variation will be dealt with on an individual basis and judgements will remain at the discretion of the Headteacher and the Governing Board.

Indoor Shoes for KS2
